



## Fall Semester Course Descriptions for Exchange Students

### **Leadership Discovery (required)**

Leadership Discovery is based on the university's educational philosophy of Brightening One Corner. In this introductory course, our students are empowered to lead assertive lives that reflect the core values of leadership by looking deeply into themselves with the question "Who am I?". This enables them to create a strong self-identity and discover their true life values and vision. With this knowledge, students can create meaningful change in their lives and become true leaders.

### **Global Leadership Discovery (Elective)**

Global Leadership Discovery is one of the courses offered in our university's unique leadership program. Through this course, students are asked the initial question, "Why think globally?" Through examination of cultural diversity and leadership qualities that are necessary in today's globalized world, students are asked to search for an answer to the basic question and define the qualities they feel are necessary to become a global leader as individuals as well as part of international organizations that include corporations, universities, NGOs, etc.

### **Cross Cultural Communication Practicum (required)**

Due to the rapidly changing global village, citizens from around the world are facing different challenges as they communicate with each other. In cross cultural communication, individuals must learn to appreciate and embrace differences in order to communicate effectively. This course aims at allowing international and domestic students the opportunity to explore each other's differences not only in language but in non-verbal communication which is imbedded in their own communication styles. Exchange students in this class will participate in the iChat program where they will be assigned a number of domestic partners who are interested in cross cultural communication exchange. The practicum aspect of this course will run in 2 rounds of 5 week sessions.

### **Beginning Korean (Language Elective)**

This course will focus on the written Korean language and rudimentary conversation. Students will be introduced to the "Hangeul," the Korean alphabet and soon find that they will be reading and writing in Korean. Basic vocabulary and everyday expressions will be the focus of this introductory course for both the written and oral language.

### **Korean History & Culture through Film (Elective)**

*– recommended for students wishing to study with Korean and foreign exchange students*

This course deals with the characteristics of Korean culture through the lens of the movie camera. Through this course, many cultural norms, historical events and societal structure will be introduced and analyzed through films so that the foreign students can gain a better understanding of Korean culture.

### **English for International Communication 2 (Elective)**

*– recommended for exchange students wishing to study with Korean students.*

This course is designed for any proficiency level of English as a foreign language. Throughout the course of the semester, activities are designed for students to gain experiential learning of English as a tool for primarily oral communication in the international context where cultural influences on language can effect meaning. The students enrolled in this class will be from a variety of countries including Korea.

### **Corporate Cadence 2 (Elective)**

– *recommended for exchange students wishing to study with Korean students.*

This course explores the strategic use of idiomatic language and professional jargon as essential tools for leadership, conflict resolution, and cross-cultural rapport in the global market. Moving beyond rote memorization, students analyze how nuanced communication impacts organizational dynamics and project outcomes through immersive, team-based corporate simulations. By mastering subtle conversational cues and professional vernacular, participants will learn to navigate high-pressure negotiations and enhance their executive presence, gaining a distinct competitive edge in international business environments.

### **Viral Vernacular for Global Commerce & Media (Elective)**

– *recommended for exchange students wishing to study with Korean students.*

This course transforms nuanced communication into a strategic asset, exploring how idiomatic language and professional jargon drive leadership, conflict resolution, and cross-cultural rapport. Students will analyze the impact of language on organizational dynamics and project outcomes, learning to deploy precise expressions in high-pressure negotiations and interpret subtle conversational cues. Through immersive, team-based corporate simulations, participants will master professional vernacular to build executive presence and navigate the complexities of the international business community, ultimately gaining a distinct competitive edge in two global industries.
